


1. My child is happy at this school




2. My child feels safe at this school




3. The school ensures its pupils are well behaved ^{20 responses}




4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with it quickly and effectively ^{20 responses}




5. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn throughout the year ^{20 responses}




6. When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly $^{20\,\mathrm{responses}}$




7. The school has high expectations for my child ^{20 responses}




8. There is a good range of subjects available for my child at this school $_{20\,\mathrm{responses}}$




9. My child enjoys taking part in school enrichment activities (e.g. sports & science week) ^{20 responses}




10. The school supports my child's personal development ²⁰ responses




11. I feel that my child is cherished at this school ^{20 responses}



12. I feel that my child is challenged at this school ^{20 responses}




13. My child feels valued and accepted as a Child of God at this school ²⁰ responses

The lunch options - menu hasn't changed the whole year, large number of meals based on potatoes, very limited vegetarian options.

- Challenge the higher ability kids in class more to keep them interested in learning.
- Start a buddy system between Reception starters and year 6s to help them settle.
- Restart stay and play in Reception for parents to interact with their children in the classroom setting.
