

Powerful Knowledge

The Gospels in the Bible give accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection. The book of Luke gives an account of a number of resurrection appearances. Belief in Jesus' resurrection confirms to Christians that Jesus is the incarnate son of God, but also that death is not the end. This belief gives Christians hope for life with God, starting now and continuing in a new life (heaven). This belief is reflected in Christian worship in both modern and traditional songs.





What I know already
