Big Question

How can I be Safe Online?



Key Vocabulary for the unit:

Digital footprint: The content someone shares about themselves online.

Going Online: Connecting to the internet.

Internet: Lots of computers connected to one another.

Personal information: Information about us e.g. full name, address, birthday.

Post online: Placing information (such as photos or comments) on the internet.

Download: To save a file from the internet or another computer.

Sharing online: Sharing content (music, photo, videos) or information online.

Smart device: A device on which you can use apps, a camera and make voice/video calls.

Powerful knowledge/skills for this unit:

- To know that the internet is many devices connected to one another.
- To know what to do if you feel unsafe or worried online – tell a trusted adult.
- To know that people you do not know on the internet (online) are strangers and are not always who they say they are.
- To know that to stay safe online it is important to keep personal information safe.
- To know that 'sharing' and 'posting' relate to the giving versus placing of information online.

What I should already know from EYFS:

- What the internet is and what it is used for.
- Why it is important to ask a grown-up before going on the internet.
- To be careful when talking to people we don't know online.
